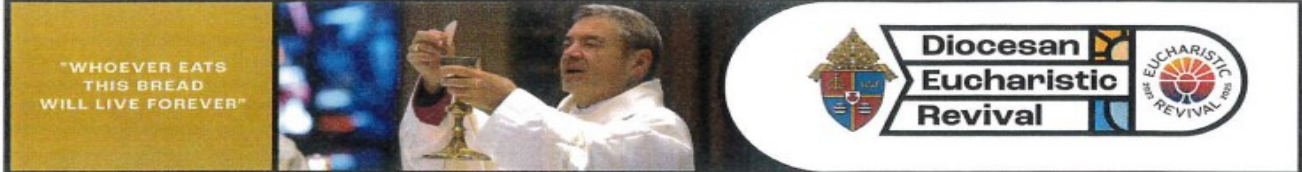

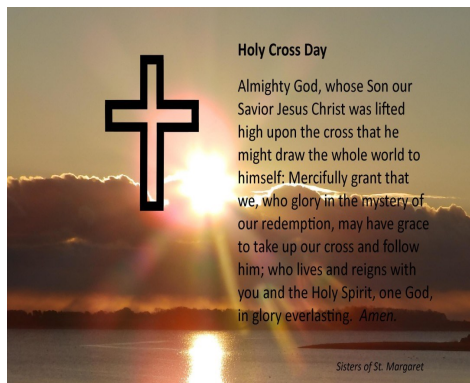

The Exaltation of the Cross / September 14



Question:

What is the history behind feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross?

Answer:

Emperor Constantine's mother, Helena, is credited with having discovered the true cross around 330. She traveled to the Holy Land and uncovered the places associated with Jesus' life. Legend has it that Helena uncovered three crosses but was not able to detect the true cross until each of them was laid on a leper. Only one of them cured the leper, proving it to be the true cross. A great church was built at the site, and soon various portions of the cross were sent to other churches as relics to be venerated. The day after the dedication of the Church of the Holy Sepulchre, September 14, 335, the actual cross was displayed for veneration. Egeria, a women traveler to Jerusalem around the year 386, kept a diary that has survived. She tells of the unique veneration of the wood of the cross that took place on Good Friday, something maintained ritually

to this very day. The Exaltation of the Holy Cross focuses on the gift of love that Jesus manifested by his total gift of self, offered for all. The cross, the ultimate form of capital punishment in its day, has become for us the ultimate symbol of love and triumph over evil and death.

Nuestra Señora de los Dolores



Memoria de Nuestra Señora de los Dolores, que de pie junto a la cruz de Jesús, su Hijo, estuvo íntima y fielmente asociada a su pasión salvadora. Fue la nueva Eva, que por su admirable obediencia contribuyó a la vida, al contrario de lo que hizo la primera mujer, que por su desobediencia trajo la muerte. Los Evangelios muestran a la Virgen Santísima presente, con inmenso amor y dolor de Madre, junto a la cruz en el momento de la muerte redentora de su Hijo, uniéndose a sus padecimientos y mereciendo por ello el título de Corredentora. La representación pictórica e iconográfica de la Virgen Dolorosa mueve el corazón de los creyentes a justipreciar el valor de la redención y a descubrir mejor la malicia del pecado. Bajo el título de la Virgen de la Soledad o de los Dolores se venera a María en muchos lugares.

¿Que nos enseña la Virgen de los Dolores? La imagen de la Virgen Dolorosa nos enseña a tener fortaleza ante los sufrimientos de la vida. Encontremos en Ella una compañía y una fuerza para dar sentido a los propios sufrimientos.

Cuida tu fe: Algunos te dirán que Dios no es bueno porque permite el dolor y el sufrimiento en las personas. El sufrimiento humano es parte de la naturaleza del hombre, es algo inevitable en la vida, y Jesús nos ha enseñado, con su propio sufrimiento, que el dolor tiene valor de salvación. Lo importante es el sentido que nosotros le demos. Debemos ser fuertes ante el dolor y ofrecerlo a Dios por la salvación de las almas. De este modo podremos convertir el sufrimiento en sacrificio (sacrum-facere = hacer algo sagrado). Esto nos ayudará a amar más a Dios y, además, llevaremos a muchas almas al Cielo, uniendo nuestro sacrificio al de Cristo.

Oración: María, tú que has pasado por un dolor tan grande y un sufrimiento tan profundo, ayúdanos a seguir tu ejemplo ante las dificultades de nuestra propia vida.

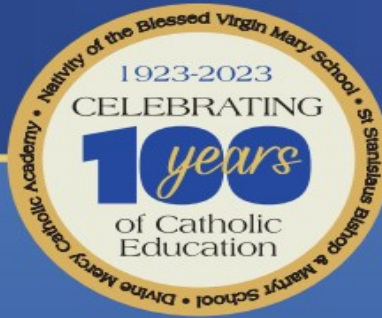
