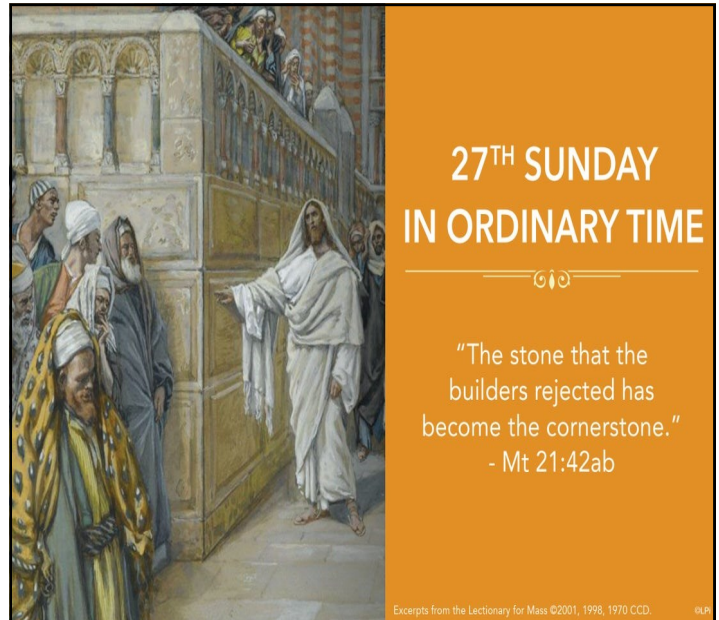

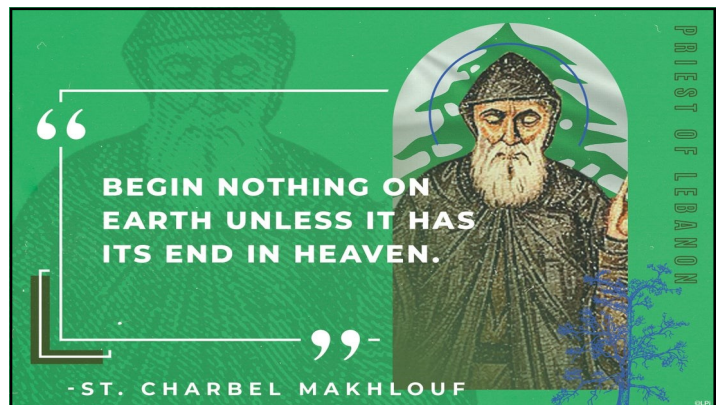

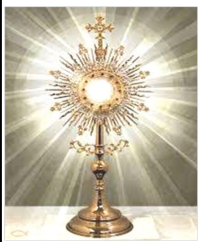

### (PRACTICING) CATHOLIC - RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS

#### *The Gift that Gives Back*



It never ceases to amaze me how often I fall into the trap and end up grumbling about the greatest gifts in my life. A husband, children, a life that is full almost to bursting: these are things for which I once begged God. These are the jewels in the crown of my life.

Oh, but the children need care. Constant care. And a husband — a real flesh-and-blood creation of God, entrusted to me by God, to help me be holy and relying on me for holiness in turn — well, that relationship is a lot of work, isn't it? And a "full life" — I laugh to think of it, and then I blush with shame, because I admit sometimes, I do yearn for a life that is a little less ... full.

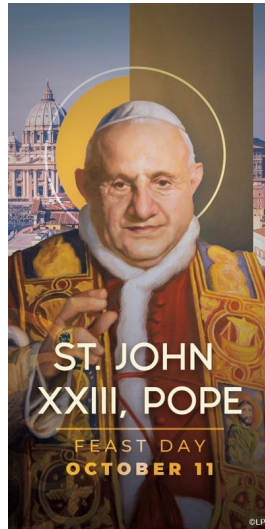
A full life can leave you awfully tired at the end of the day. I would imagine it's the same for everyone, no matter your life circumstances or vocation.

Your greatest blessings are also those things that require much of you, more than you imagined you would ever be asked to give. The biggest jewels make the crown heavy. But if we had any of these gifts without the effort it takes to maintain them, would they be half as sweet? In this same way, the work of the vineyard is opened to us through baptism; we are given the chance to produce fruit for the kingdom. It's a chance we never dared to dream would be given to us.

It's a gift. But just like with any gift worth having, it requires effort. Upkeep. Work. It requires that we give in return. And it's the giving that somehow, mystically, transforms us. It's the giving that turns into the gift itself.

**"...the kingdom of God will be taken away from you and given to a people that will produce its fruit." — Matthew 21:4**

Saint John XIII was born Angelo Giuseppe Roncalli on November 25, 1881, in a small village in Italy. He was ordained in 1904 and later earned a doctorate in canon law. During World War I he served as a stretcher-bearer and chaplain for the Italian army. Beginning in 1925 he served as a Vatican diplomat, first in Bulgaria, then in Greece and Turkey. From 1935 through the Second World War he helped save thousands of Jewish people. In 1944 he was named papal nuncio to France. He was named cardinal and appointed patriarch of Venice in 1953. A quiet pastoral life passing into retirement, however, was not in God's plan for the saint. Angelo Giuseppe Roncalli was elected Pope in 1958 and took the name John. His papacy was short, but full of action. He transformed the Vatican, calling for openness, a spirit of ecumenism, and the setting aside of politics. He called the Second Vatican Council in the fall of 1962, the first meeting of its kind in almost a century, setting the agenda to work for the spiritual regeneration of the Church. His efforts changed the face of the Catholic Church. At the same time worked diligently and publicly to ease tensions during the Cuban missile crisis, pleading with leaders for the end of the Cold War. Saint John XXIII's kindness, sense of pastoral care, and works of reconciliation and peacemaking made him beloved not only to Catholics but to people around the world. He died on June 3, 1963. He was beatified in 2000 by St. John Paul II, and canonized by Pope Francis in 2014.



San Juan XIII nació Angelo Giuseppe Roncalli el 25 de noviembre de 1881 en un pequeño pueblo de Italia.

Fue ordenado en 1904 y luego obtuvo un doctorado en derecho canónico. Durante la Primera Guerra Mundial sirvió como camillero y capellán del ejército italiano. A partir de 1925 se desempeñó como diplomático del Vaticano, primero en Bulgaria, luego en Grecia y Turquía. Desde 1935 hasta la Segunda Guerra Mundial ayudó a salvar a miles de judíos. En 1944 fue nombrado nuncio papal en Francia. Fue nombrado cardenal y patriarca de Venecia en 1953. Sin embargo, una vida pastoral tranquila que pasa a la jubilación no estaba en el plan de Dios para el santo.

Angelo Giuseppe Roncalli fue elegido Papa en 1958 y tomó el nombre de Juan. Su papado fue corto, pero lleno de acción. Transformó el Vaticano, llamando a la apertura, un espíritu de ecumenismo y el abandono de la política. Convocó el Concilio Vaticano Segundo en el otoño de 1962, la primera reunión de este tipo en casi un siglo, estableciendo la agenda para trabajar por la regeneración espiritual de la Iglesia. Sus esfuerzos cambiaron el rostro de la Iglesia Católica. Al mismo tiempo, trabajó diligente y públicamente para aliviar las tensiones durante la crisis de los misiles en Cuba, suplicando a los líderes el fin de la Guerra Fría. La bondad, el sentido del cuidado pastoral y las obras de reconciliación y pacificación de San Juan XXIII lo hicieron amado no solo por los católicos sino también por las personas de todo el mundo. Murió el 3 de junio de 1963. Fue beatificado en 2000 por San Juan Pablo II y canonizado por el Papa Francisco en 2014.

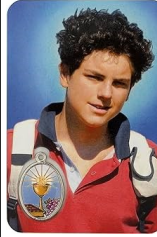
