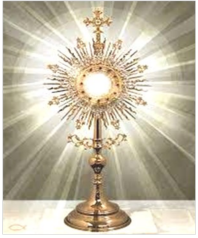


Prayer for Priests

Saint Martin of Tours | November 11

Saint Martin of Tours was born a pagan in what is now Hungary around 316, but he was raised in Italy where his father, a tribune, was posted. At 15 he was compelled to serve in the Roman military, though he was already a catechumen. There is a popular legend that while on campaign the saint cut his cloak in half to share with a cold beggar. That night he dreamed of Jesus and his cloak was restored. He was baptized at 18.

Only two years after his baptism, he was released from the military, he had refused his battle pay and to fight saying he was a soldier for Christ. He is the first recognized conscientious objector.

After his release from the military, he became a disciple of Hilary of Poitiers. He worked diligently against the Arian heresy, which denies the divinity of Jesus Christ, and established a community of hermits near Poitiers in 361, the first French monastery.

In 371 he reluctantly became bishop of Tour. Nearby, he founded a second monastery, Marmoutier, because he preferred the life of a monk he retreated often. In 384 there was a popular heresy infecting the Church in Spain, led by the bishop Priscillian and his followers. The emperor Magnus Maximus became involved, ordering the execution of the heretics. Saint Martin opposed the executions and protested the emperor's involvement in Church matters. Unfortunately, the Priscillians were executed anyway.

Saint Martin died in Candes-Saint-Martin, Gaul in 397. He is notably one of the first saints who was not martyred. He is the patron saint of France.



San Martín de Tours nació pagano en lo que ahora es Hungría alrededor del año 316, pero se crió en Italia, donde su padre, un tribuno, estaba destinado. A los 15 años fue obligado a servir en el ejército romano, aunque ya era catecúmeno.

Existe una leyenda popular que, estando en campaña, el santo cortó su manto por la mitad para compartirlo con un mendigo frío. Esa noche soñó con Jesús y su manto fue restaurado. Fue bautizado a los 18 años.

Solo dos años después de su bautismo, fue liberado del ejército, se había negado a recibir su paga de batalla y pelear diciendo que era un soldado de Cristo. Es el primer objeto de conciencia reconocido.

Después de su liberación del ejército, se convirtió en discípulo de Hilario de Poitiers. Trabajó diligentemente contra la herejía arriana, que niega la divinidad de Jesucristo, y estableció una comunidad de ermitaños cerca de Poitiers en 361, el primer monasterio francés.

En 371 se convirtió de mala gana en obispo de Tour. Cerca de allí, fundó un segundo monasterio, Marmoutier, porque prefería la vida de un monje al que se retiraba con frecuencia. En el año 384 hubo una herejía popular que contagió a la Iglesia en España, encabezada por el obispo Prisciliano y sus seguidores.

El emperador Magnus Maximus se involucró y ordenó la ejecución de los herejes. San Martín se opuso a las ejecuciones y protestó por la participación del emperador en los asuntos de la Iglesia. Desafortunadamente, los priscilianos fueron ejecutados de todos modos.

San Martín murió en Candes-Saint-Martin, Galia en 397. Es notablemente uno de los primeros santos que no fue martirizado. Es el patrón de Francia.

Help me to trust You completely.

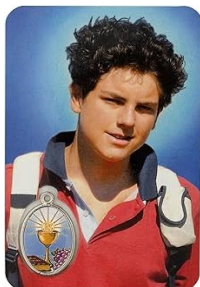
Send Your Holy Spirit into my mind and heart so I can see the gifts You have given me and hear Your call to serve the Church.
