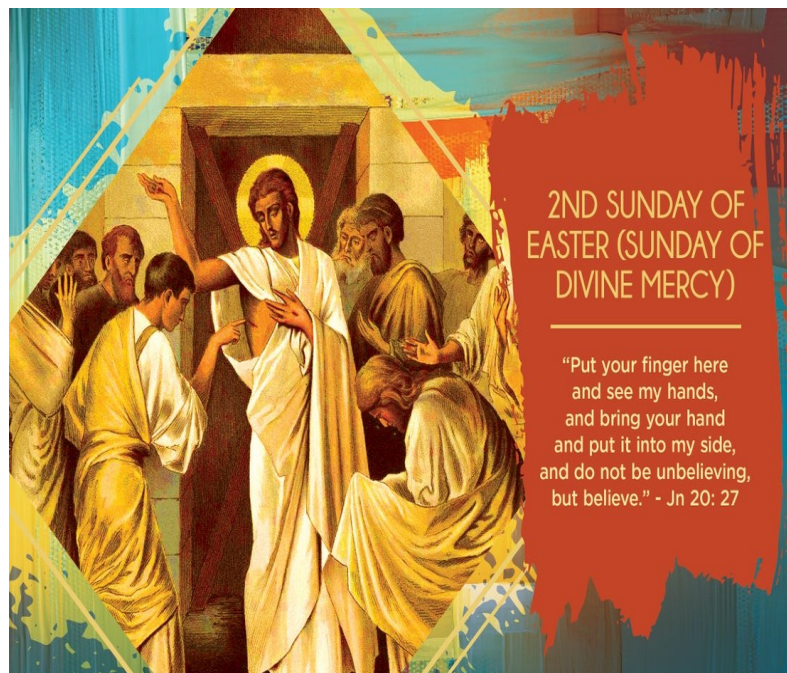

## The Chaplet of the Divine Mercy

### 1. Opening Prayers:

First, make the Sign of the Cross. Touch the forehead, then the chest, then the left shoulder, then the right shoulder, while saying:

**In the Name** of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

**Recite this opening prayer once:**

**You expired, O Jesus**, but the Source of Life gushed forth for souls and the Ocean of Mercy opened up for the whole world. O Fount of Life, unfathomable Divine Mercy, envelop the whole world and empty Yourself out upon us.

**Recite the following prayer three times:**

**O Blood and Water**, which gushed forth from the Heart of Jesus as a fount of mercy for us, I trust in You.

**Then recite one Our Father, one Hail Mary, and the Apostles' Creed:**

### 2. The Decades of the Chaplet:

After the Opening Prayers, the next prayers are said in sets of ten, called 'decades.' A set of five decades is called a 'chaplet.' The prayers are said using ordinary Rosary beads.

On the single large bead (before each set of ten smaller beads) recite:

**Eternal Father, I offer You the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Your dearly beloved Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, in atonement for our sins and those of the whole world.**

Then, on each of the ten smaller beads, recite:

**For the sake of His sorrowful Passion, have mercy on us and on the whole world.**

(Alternate version of this prayer: For the sake of Jesus Christ's sorrowful Passion and death on the Cross, have mercy on us and on the whole world.)

After each set of ten prayers, many persons add:

**O Blood and Water**, which gushed forth from the Heart of Jesus as a fount of mercy for us, I trust in You.

Repeat the above set of prayers, called a decade, five times to complete one **Divine Mercy Chaplet**.

**3. Closing Prayers:** Recite the following prayer three times:

**Holy God**, Holy Mighty One, Holy Immortal One, have mercy on us and on the whole world.

Then recite this closing prayer:

**Eternal God**, Your Mercy is endless, and Your treasury of compassion is inexhaustible. Look with kindness upon us and increase Your Mercy within us, so that, in difficult moments, we may not despair, nor become despondent, but may, with great confidence, submit ourselves to Your Holy Will, which is Love and Mercy itself.

Amen.

Finally, make the Sign of the Cross again:

**In the Name** of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

## La Coronilla de la Divina Misericordia

### 1. Oraciones de apertura:

Primero, haz la Señal de la Cruz. Toca la frente, luego el pecho, luego el hombro izquierdo, luego el hombro derecho, mientras dices: En el Nombre del Padre, y del Hijo, y del Espíritu Santo. Amén.

**Recita esta oración inicial una vez:**

Expiraste, Jesús, pero la fuente de vida brotó para las almas y el mar de misericordia se abrió para el mundo entero. Oh fuente de vida, insondable Misericordia Divina, abarca al mundo entero y derrámate sobre nosotros (Diario, 1319).

**Recita esta Oración Tres veces:**

Oh Sangre y Agua que brotaste del Corazón de Jesús, como una Fuente de Misericordia para nosotros, en Ti confío (Diario, 84).

**Luego se reza un Padrenuestro, un Avemaría y el Credo de los Apóstoles:**

### 2. Las Décadas de la Coronilla:

Después de las Oraciones de Apertura, las siguientes oraciones son dichas en conjuntos de diez, llamados 'décadas'. Un conjunto de cinco décadas se llama 'coronilla'. Las oraciones se dicen utilizando cuentas ordinarias del Rosario.

En la única cuenta grande (antes de cada juego de diez cuentas más pequeñas) recite:

**Padre Eterno, te ofrezco el Cuerpo y la Sangre, el Alma y la Divinidad de Tu amadísimo Hijo, nuestro Señor Jesucristo, como propiciación por nuestros pecados y los del Mundo entero.**

Luego, en cada una de las diez cuentas más pequeñas, recite:

**Por Su dolorosa Pasión, ten misericordia de nosotros y del mundo entero.**

(Versión alternativa de esta oración: Por el bien de La dolorosa Pasión y muerte de Jesucristo en la Cruz, ten piedad de nosotros y del mundo entero.)

Repita el conjunto de oraciones anterior, llamado una década, cinco veces para completar una **Coronilla a la Divina Misericordia**.

### 3. Oraciones finales:

Recita la siguiente oración tres veces:

**Santo Dios, Santo Fuerte, Santo Inmortal, ten piedad de nosotros y del mundo entero.**

Luego recita esta oración final:

**Oh Dios Eterno**, en quien la misericordia es infinita y el tesoro de compasión inagotable, vuelve a nosotros Tu mirada bondadosa y aumenta Tu misericordia en nosotros, para que en momentos difíciles no nos desesperemos ni nos desalentamos, sino que, con gran confianza, nos sometamos a Tu santa voluntad, que es el Amor y la Misericordia Mismos  
Amen

Finalmente, haz de nuevo la Señal de la Cruz:

**En el Nombre del Padre**, y del Hijo, y del  
El espíritu santo. Amén.

### DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY FEAST



Today is the feast of Divine Mercy Sunday, instituted by St. John Paul II, Pope. After the 11:30am Mass we will expose the Blessed Sacrament and have Divine Mercy prayers including the Divine Mercy Chaplet and Benediction of the Most Blessed Sacrament.

There is the possibility for all the faithful to gain a plenary indulgence in order to receive in great abundance the gift of the consolation of the Holy Spirit. In this way, the faithful can foster a growing love for God and for their neighbor, and after they have obtained God's pardon, they in turn might be persuaded to show a prompt pardon to their brothers and sisters. *The plenary indulgence* is granted (under the usual conditions of a sacramental confession, the sacrament of Mercy, Eucharistic communion and a prayer for the intentions of the Supreme Pontiff) to the faithful who, on Divine Mercy Sunday, in a spirit that is completely detached from the affection for a sin, even a venial sin, recite the *Our Father and the Creed*, and also adding a devout prayer (e.g. *Merciful Jesus, I trust in you!*).
