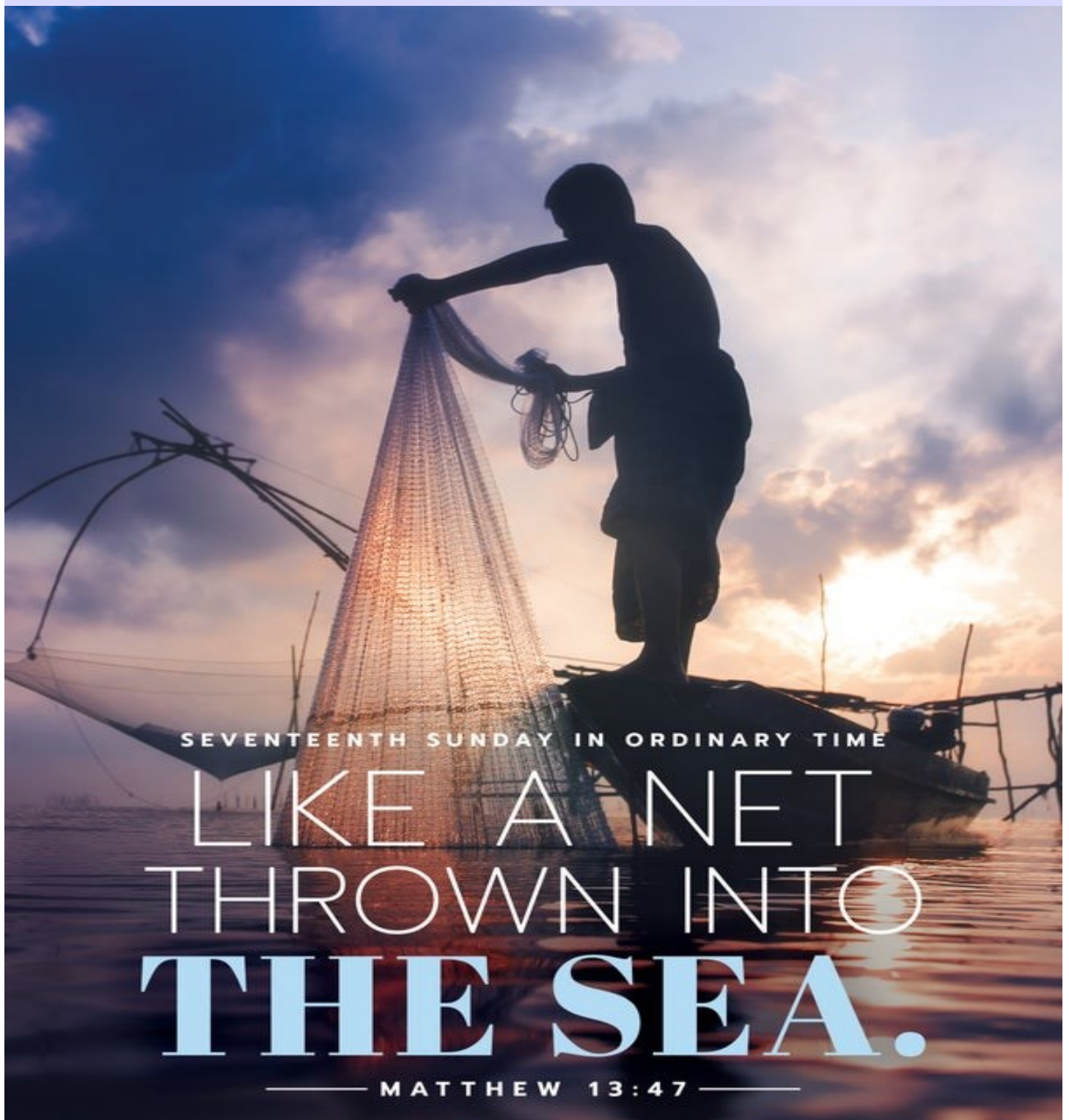

We Come to Share Our Lives with You,

Over the past two weekends, I tried to give you, brothers and sisters, some idea of who we are as Friars, Priests, and human beings in general. Where we are from, how we get here, and what we do. I also shared a little about our vast Franciscan Order (which I will continue to do from time to time). You probably realize that our coming here as Franciscans is not merely another assignment, as it has been for the diocesan priests who have served this parish until now.

We came here as a community. One of the characteristics of our Franciscan life is living in community. We don't only live in the same Rectory. We live together as a community of brothers (that's why I will refer to ourselves as Friars, which in the U.S. is usually used for Franciscan priests). We will probably refer to the Rectory building more and more often as the Friary. Someone joked last weekend after the holy mass that we both look very alike (we both disagree), like brothers, and I said: "But we are brothers, actually." Yes, we are brothers. So, as a community of Franciscan Friars, we come here to this parish to serve God and you, our parishioners, and to establish our Franciscan life among you. Be sure that we will share our Franciscan heritage (maybe our parishioners with Italian ancestry would be more familiar with that, since St. Francis is the Patron Saint of Italy and is really beloved by all Italians – which we, as Franciscans, very much understand and approve).

As Franciscans (not only guys from Poland, but Franciscans), we have a distinctive style and personality. We try to bring joy and laughter to those around us; we try to follow Jesus as our Founder, St. Francis of Assisi did, by focusing on Jesus alone, who, out of love for people, became man, suffered and died, conquered death, and now is with His Father reigning. But here, among us, He is present in the Eucharist. Those are the main pillars of Franciscan spirituality: the Incarnation of the Son of God, His humanity, His suffering, and His presence in the Eucharist. Of course, we will have an opportunity to talk and write about it a little more later.

Our style is also distinct because we take responsibility for the parish community as a community of brothers. Of course, the pastor is responsible and answers directly to the bishop, but the bishop entrusted this parish not only to the pastor but also to the Order of the Conventual Franciscans. Even though the chain of command must be clearly maintained, we operate as a community. That's why you will see us acting as a community of priests, not only the pastor.

Still, I am your pastor now, meaning I have to be your shepherd. The word pastor is derived from the Latin word for shepherd. A shepherd is supposed to lead the flock. This means he has to walk first. It is not an easy task, so together with Fr. Jacek I need your prayers, please.

Second, the shepherd is responsible for the sheep; his goal is to lead them to their destination. That means my task is sometimes to correct you on your course. That is why shepherds have their staffs. They need to ensure that all sheep will stay within the flock.

So, please, we need to pray for each other and help each other.

Adoration of the Most Blessed Sacrament

It is a privilege for us to be able to adore the Lord in our church. The Eucharist is exposed Monday to Saturday after the **9:00 AM** Mass and kept on the Altar ending with the Angelus and Benediction at **12:00 PM**

The Five First Saturdays devotion is one of the principal points of the Fatima message. It centers on the urgent need for mankind to offer reparation and expiate for the many injuries that the Immaculate Heart of Mary suffers from the hands of both impious and indifferent men.

On the First Saturday during 5 Consecutive Months, the Devotion consists of:

1. Going to Confession,
 2. Receiving the Sacrament of Holy Communion,
 3. Saying five decades of the Rosary,
 4. Meditating for 15 minutes on the mysteries of the Rosary.
- All this offered in REPARATION for the sins of blasphemy and ingratitude committed against the Immaculate Heart of Mary.
